RESEARCH: As a modern world environmental historian, I investigate patterns in humans' relationship with the environment across global landscapes. I am particularly interested in imperialism and colonial contexts, connections across borders, and the experiences of marginalized groups. My work uses interdisciplinary approaches to inform history and to offer relevant applications in contemporary society.
