Notes:

- Students should take HIST 501 and HIST 611 in their first year.
- Graduate School permits no more than 9 credit hours of undergraduate level credits applied toward a program of study (though additional credits beyond those required are allowed).
- There is often a high demand for HIST 539 World Environmental History. The best spot for it to be offered is odd falls. This allows for all CRM/HP to take regardless of entry semester. Second best spot is odd springs, though there will be competition with Anthropology classes.
- The internship and practicum work is typically completed over the summer in between the first and second year with the credit hours taken in the fall of the second year.
- Liberal Arts Plan A students should take 2 research seminars before taking HIST 699 Thesis in the final semester for either 3 or 6 credit hours.
